Teacher Recruitment Process

Some of you may be aware that we have been running a recruitment process to select teachers for a pool of teachers from which we will select according to our 2018 needs. This process is governed by Department of Education policy and employment law.

Applicants are selected for the pool based on having addressed selection criteria, work experience, referee checks and meeting the contextual needs of the school.

We have had 278 applicants for the pool, mostly of a very high standard. A panel of 4, including a staffing consultant, have been part of this process.

While I appreciate the positive feedback from some parents regarding some of our teachers, it can have no bearing on the outcome of our staffing process.

Thank you for being supportive of our five fixed term teachers while they go through this process.

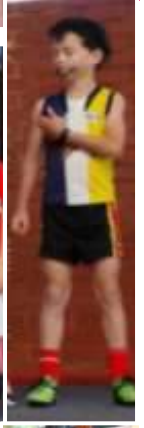
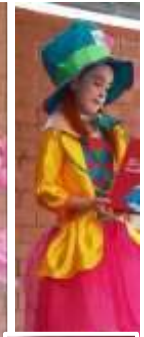
Book Week Parade

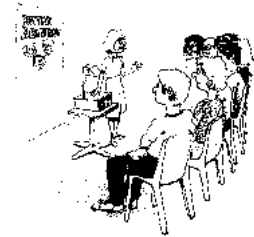
