Thanks Di and Grant for coordinating this!

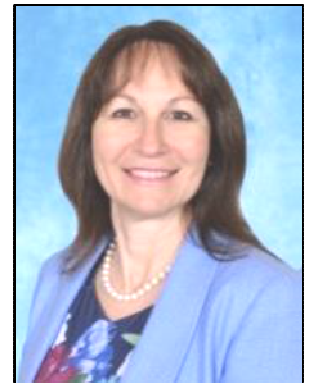
Plans for improvement of grounds!

Our wonderful P & C has been working hard and developing plans for an amphitheatre to be built at the north end of the undercover area. The plans were inspired by concept drawing done in 2005 by Michael Pearce, father of Josh in Year 6.

We will create a multifunction outdoor centre which could be used at assemblies, concerts and drama performances. Shade trees will be planted at the back of the amphitheatre to provide a beautiful relaxing cool seating area.
